The Brihadeeswarar Temple, also known as the Tanjore (Thanjavur) Periya Kovil or Tanjore Pragaadeeswara Temple, is a magnificent example of ancient Dravidian architecture located in Tamil Nadu, India. Built by the great Chola king Raja Raja Chola I in the 11th century, the UNESCO World Heritage Site stands as a testament to the grandeur and precision of Chola engineering and artistry. Dedicated to Lord Shiva, the temple is renowned for its massive central vimana (tower), which rises over 200 feet and is crowned by a single granite stone weighing around 80 tons. The temple complex features detailed sculptures, frescoes, and inscriptions that provide insight into the cultural and religious life of the Chola period.

It is one of the largest temples in India and an architectural marvel of South India. The temple walls are adorned with intricate carvings depicting mythological stories and daily life. The Nandi (sacred bull) statue at the entrance is carved from a single stone and weighs about 25 tons. Even after a thousand years, the temple continues to attract devotees, historians, and tourists alike.
